Mission of the Gynecologic Cancer Foundation

The mission of the Gynecologic Cancer Foundation (GCF) is to ensure public awareness of gynecologic cancer prevention, early diagnosis and proper treatment. In addition the Foundation supports research and training related to gynecologic cancers. GCF advances this mission by increasing public and private funds that aid in the development and implementation of programs to meet these goals.

GCF programs are designed to:

- 1) Increase public awareness of ways to prevent, detect and treat gynecologic cancers;*
- 2) Increase public awareness of the central role of gynecologic oncologists in these activities;*
- 3) Train a cadre of clinicians/scientists to participate in clinically relevant research in collaboration with the National Cancer Institute;*
- 4) Support promising, innovative research related to malignancies arising in gynecologic organs.*

GCF is 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization under the U.S. Internal Revenue Code Tax Exempt number is 36-3797707.

GCF Funded Programs 2002

Research Grants and Awards

In April, GCF mailed the Research Grants and Awards booklet to all of SGO/GCF members. The research booklet describes grants and training announcements, and history of GCF research grant award winners and GCF/NCI Fellows. This year's winners for GCF awards are as follows:

Florence & Marshall Schwid Ovarian Cancer Research Fund

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support innovative research related to ovarian cancer and assists the investigator in bridging long term funding. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Elizabeth Swisher, M.D., University of Washington was the 2002 recipient of this research grant for her application entitled, "*Impact of Epigenetic Modulation on DNA Repair Genes on Chemoresistance and Survival in Ovarian Cancer*".

GCF/National Ovarian Cancer Coalition (NOCC) Ovarian Cancer Research Grant

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support innovated research related to early detection for ovarian cancer and assists the investigator in bridging long term funding. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

William Cliby, M.D., Mayo Clinic was the 2002 recipient of this research grant for his application entitled, "Validation of an Avian Ovarian Cancer Model".

GCF/Bristol-Myers Squibb Oncology Young Investigator Award

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support innovated research related to gynecologic cancer and the applicant must be in their third year of ABOG approved post residency fellowship training program in gynecologic oncology or junior faculty in their first three years post fellowship.

Warner Huh, M.D., University of Alabama at Birmingham was the 2002 recipient of this research grant for his application entitled, "*Transduced Dendritic Cell Therapy for Cervical Cancer-Alternative Vector Targeting and Conjugate Strategies*".

GCF/National Cancer Institute (NCI) Research Training Fellowship

The awardee will study at the National Cancer Institute for 2 years for \$50,000/year per trainee. Laboratories in all divisions of the NCI are available to this program.

Applicants who are selected will be assisted in identifying the laboratory in which they will carry out their research. The applicant must have completed or be in the final year of an approved fellowship in gynecologic oncology. Each candidate is required to have three letters of recommendation, one of which must be from the director of the candidate's fellowship program.

Monica Jones, M.D., began her fellowship beginning in July 1999 for her project "Gene Expression Profiling in Ovarian Neoplasms" and is currently carrying out her clinical work at Mayo Clinic.

Amir Jazaeri, M.D., began his fellowship at NCI in July 2000 for his project "Use of cDNA microarrays in evaluation of ovarian cancer" and is currently carrying out his clinical work at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Texas.

Ginger Gardner, M.D., began her fellowship at NCI in July 2000 for her project "The development and characterization of novel retinoids for the chemoprevention and treatment of ovarian cancer" and is currently carrying out her clinical work at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York.

Kristin K. Zorn, M.D., began her fellowship at NCI in July 2001 for her project "Gene Expressions Profile of Ovarian Cancer Histologic Subtypes" and is currently carrying out her clinical work at University of Oklahoma.

Award for the Outstanding Paper by a Fellow/Resident Award Recipient

GCF Public Outreach/ Education Programs

Gynecologic Cancer Foundation Information Hotline 1-800-444-4441

In an effort to provide valuable information on gynecologic cancer to the public, the GCF provides an "Information Hotline."

Anyone who dials 1-800-444-4441 will be offered 5 types of information. All of these services are free:

- 1) By indicating their telephone area code, they will randomly receive the name, address and telephone of gynecologic oncologists in their area code;
- 2) Informational brochures such as "*Maintain Your Gynecologic Health*", *The Ovarian Cancer National Resource List*, "*Beating the Odds*", *After Breast Cancer: What you need to know about your gynecologic health*, and the WCN.ORG brochures are sent by fax or mail if requested;
- 3) Information on the Women's Cancer Network (WCN) www.wcn.org;
- 4) Instructions for contacting the Gynecologic Cancer Foundation by mail or telephone;
- 5) A directory of all gynecologic oncologists and related specialists will be sent by mail. This allows the caller to contact specialists outside their area code.

Annual Meeting Media Campaign

For the third year in a row, the SGO/GCF newsroom flourished with activity. With breaking research news from SGO presented during the meeting, Drs. Roberta Ness, Sandra Brooks, Maurie Markman, Curt Burger, Richard Buller, Lynn Hartmann and David Mutch bolstered the media team's pitches by answering questions and conducting interviews with a number of media outlets. As in years past, the SGO/GCF-sponsored campaign focused on specific research papers that had particular appeal to both healthcare and consumer news media. Despite the need to compete for journalists' attention, the results demonstrated that media continues to be interested in research released at the SGO Annual Meeting.

The campaign secured 75 print and online placements, reaching a total of 51 million people. Highlights include several stories in Reuters Health, the Atlanta Journal-Constitution, CBS Marketwatch online, Yahoo! Daily News and several major market daily newspapers.

Hometown Radio Program

Results show that it was another successful year for the SGO/GCF-sponsored radio program that connected gynecologic oncologists with radio stations in their hometown regions. Over 70 SGO members delivered key messages about gynecologic cancer awareness and the lifesaving role of gynecologic oncologists during their interviews. After the meeting, members received a warm welcome from their hometown media. In total, interviews ran on more than 1,200 stations and reached over 38 million people. SGO/GCF is grateful to Impath for their support of this outreach program.

Public Service Award (s)

GCF was honored to present three amazing women with this prestigious award. The following women were named as the 2002 GCF Public Service Award recipients:

Television actress and cancer survivor Fran Drescher for her commitment and dedication to gynecologic cancer awareness, and participation in GCF's public service announcement.

Cindy Melancon, ovarian cancer survivor, editor CONVERSATIONS: The International Ovarian Cancer Connection newsletter for her tireless efforts of helping to raise awareness and education for ovarian cancer.

Beth Karlan, M.D., Director, Gynecologic Oncology, Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center for her ongoing commitment to raising awareness of gynecologic cancer through her various activities within the Society and Foundation.

Public Service Announcement (PSA)

GCF worked with the television actress Fran Drescher on the production of a PSA which promotes the Foundation's 1-800-444-4441 Information Hotline, Women's Cancer Network and the importance about early detection of gynecologic cancer. The PSA launched in May and has been played more than 7,000 times, and has reached more than 90 million viewers with our Foundation's message. This has also been shown at sporting events such as the Houston Astros baseball game and the Los Angeles Kings hockey game. Dateline NBC, reaching millions of viewers, also showed clips of the PSA.

Video News Release (VNR)

GCF produced a Video News Release (VNR) which is a news story that was sent to television stations and cable systems for broadcast use. The VNR which filmed a mother-daughter pair of cancer survivors, who shared their story to show that women can survive and thrive after a cancer diagnosis.

The VNR was released in January and has reached more than 3.5 million viewers and has aired on news stations across the country. It is with these stories we hope that more women will educate themselves about cancers of the female reproductive system.

Collaboration with Miss Universe Organization

GCF partnered with the Miss Universe Organization to carry the message about gynecologic health and cancer. Miss USA spoke about gynecologic cancer as part of her public education platform in collaboration with SGO/GCF at the Congressional Reception that was held in Washington in September. We felt that her attendance at the reception helped raise awareness and promote congressional participation in future events.

NOCC and GCF Joined Forces to Raise Awareness

GCF is grateful to the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition (NOCC) Connecticut Chapter for urging legislators from the State of Connecticut which provided GCF with an educational grant to support the re-print of an already existing educational tool, GCF's *Maintain Your Gynecologic Health* brochure.

Patient Brochures

Maintain Your Gynecologic Health With Education and Early Detection, was designed to help women understand how reproductive cancers are diagnosed and treated, and what symptoms are associated with each disease is now offered in English and Spanish. Copies of this brochure are disseminated from the GCF Headquarters, GCF's 1-800-444-4441 Information Hotline, and mailed upon request to allied organizations and patient support groups. The *"Beating the Odds"*, Ovarian Cancer National Resource List also in English and Spanish, Women's Cancer Network (WCN) brochure which describes the WCN's Web site and *After Breast Cancer: What you need to know about your gynecologic health* explains the risks/links between ovarian and breast cancer are also available upon request. GCF would like to thank the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation for their support in developing this brochure.

Women's Cancer Network (WCN) Revolutionized

Since its inception, the Women's Cancer Network (www.wcn.org) was established to provide an up-to-date information resource about gynecologic and other female cancers. Over the past three years, the site has been home to the first online risk survey in all of medicine. The WCN Web site also contains a referral guide to gynecologic oncologists, daily medical news articles, links to related sites and several other helpful features. The site has been accessed over four million times. This year, GCF partnered with CancerSource.com to help take this award-winning and well respected resource to an entirely new level by making the WCN the premiere site of information about women's cancers on the Internet. Thank you to Bristol-Myers Squibb Oncology, for their generous support allowing GCF to make this a reality.

Leap for GCF

The third annual "Leap for GCF" run/walk event was held at the SGO Annual Meeting in Miami, FL. More than 70 members and supporters kicked off their Sunday with sun, sand and some early morning exercise by participating in the 3K run/walk for the Foundation.

GCF Hosts Allied Support Group Meetings

Members of the Allied Support Group gathered at the SGO Annual Meeting in San Diego. GCF welcomed new member The Wellness Community National Organization to the Allied Support Group. This national non-profit organization based in Washington, D.C., helps people with cancer fight for their recovery by providing free psychological and emotional support as an adjunct to conventional medical treatment. GCF hosts the Allied Support Group Meetings twice a year which brings together physicians, nurses, cancer survivors, and leaders from national organizations to update each other on programs and to talk about ways the organizations can collaborate on future projects.

Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month (GCAM)

For the fourth consecutive year, GCF set out to raise awareness and educate millions about the prevention, detection and treatment of gynecologic cancers during September – *Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month* (GCAM). The complete redesign of our publicity kit suggested various ways to reach out to the community and publicize GCAM. The kit served as a model for all branded pieces that GCF produced. Promotional information and materials in the kit included event ideas, sample press releases and media advisories, and instructions for generating publicity in the community. As part of GCAM, GCF urges its members to send a letter to their Governor's to encourage them to declare September as *Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month* in their home states. Over 15 states declared September as *Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month*. Over ninety-seven placements and over 2 million impressions were the final tallies for the print media outreach. The *Charleston Post & Courier*, *San Francisco Examiner* and *Flint Journal* are just a few of the larger markets that saw GCAM coverage. Ten online placements included the *Abilene Reporter News* and *United Press International*. A matte release was sent to 10,000 newspapers across the country about the common myths associated with gynecologic cancer. The release generated more than 336 newspaper placements in 24 different states with a readership of over 15 million. Television actress Fran Drescher threw out the first pitch at the Houston Astros baseball game in honor of GCAM. Before the game took place Fran's GCF public announcement was aired on the video screen, booths were also set-up throughout the stadium with GCF materials and other information on gynecologic cancers.

Media Response Team

The media outreach for SGO/GCF takes place year-round, and the increasing media interest resulted in a growing number of requests for gynecologic oncologist spokespersons in markets across the country. During the SGO Annual Meeting the Media Response Team met to discuss a variety of topics, which included tips for making the most of media interviews. Drs. Bobbie Gostout and Beth Karlan provided an overview of media relations practices and media interview tactics for the more than 15 members in attendance. GCF would like to thank all of the members who volunteered to participate on this team and appreciate the extra time they commit to spreading the awareness message. The media response team is a network of geographically represented SGO/GCF members trained and equipped to conduct fast turnaround media interviews. Once media requests an interview, this team is alerted and a source is identified based on availability, location and/or expertise. GCF has established itself to the media as the organization to contact when in need of a gynecologic oncologist for an article.

GCF's New Promotional Video "Where There Is Knowledge There Is Hope"

GCF unveiled the new informational video about GCF and our programs. This piece, which encompassed everything about the Foundation, was distributed to potential donors and sponsors and has been shown at health fairs, medical conferences, and featured at other venues where we can share the activities of our organization. Every member of SGO/GCF received a copy of the video for his or her own awareness efforts.

GCF's Educational Supplement on "What Every Woman Needs To Know" in the Washington Post Hits the Stands

This *Washington Post*—educational supplement hit the newsstands on May 7, and was distributed to more than 800,000 readers. It was featured on www.washingtonpost.com, which reaches nearly 6 million people nationally. The 4-page supplement offered an array of articles to educate and empower women about prevention and treatment of endometrial, cervical, ovarian and gynecologic cancers. The supplement reflects the dedicated work of numerous members of the Society of Gynecologic Oncologists/Gynecologic Cancer Foundation, cancer survivors, as well as leaders from advocate and national organizations from coast to coast.

GCF friends and supporters devoted countless hours and hard work to ensure this supplement provides "What Every Woman Needs to Know" about gynecologic cancers.

Also, the University of Virginia secured funding which allowed placement of our May 2002 supplement in the *Charlottesville Daily Progress* this September.

Start Your Engines “We Drive So You Win”

Michael Goldberg, M.D., at UMD Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, and GCF Board member created a new way to give by combining his professional and personal interests to benefit GCF and spread the word about gynecologic cancers.

Dr. Goldberg began racing sports cars in 1986 and vintage cars in 1993. When noticing the amount of women who attended the races, he realized these events are an ideal platform to communicate gynecologic health messages. He donated his vintage car and painted it with the GCF and SGO logos, web site address and 1/800- number.

Dr. Goldberg took his car to numerous racing events across the country, thanks to individual \$5,000 donations from Robert Wood Johnson biographer, Lawrence Foster, Oncotech and Saint Peter’s University Hospital. The car appeared in Watkins Glen on June 7 and in Lexington, Ohio on June 14.

Because of Dr. Goldberg’s idea it inspired another collector joined the race. FJ. Montz, M.D., at Johns Hopkins Medical Institute painted his Ducati Italian motorcycle purple, and added GCF’s logo and key messages, and it was placed on a rotating display in the middle of the outpatient center at Johns Hopkins Medical Institute during GCAM. GCF educational materials will be distributed, and GCF’s video was shown during the event.

Donor Drive

“Is GCF Worth It? Worth Magazine Thought So, Do You?”

Donations have allowed GCF to support its mission and spread the gynecologic cancer message through various public outreach, advocacy, education and research initiatives. Worth Magazine reported, GCF is one of only two organizations solely focused on women’s health that was designated as one of “America’s 100 Best Charities.” The plans for the donor drive, was a mailing of GCF’s progress report detailing successes and highlights of the new programs as well as a donor pledge card was enclosed. The response from the donor drive was a great start to get members to donate.

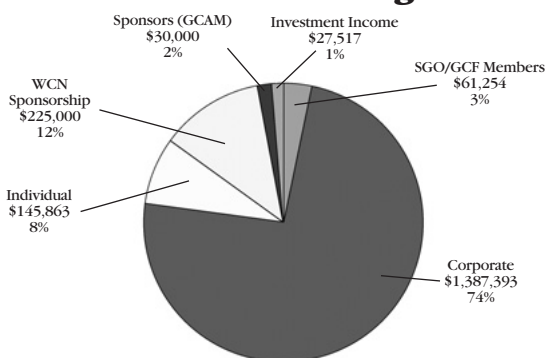

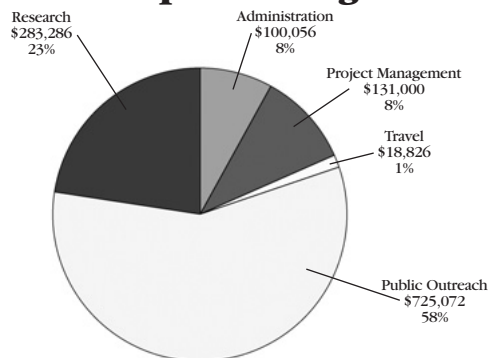

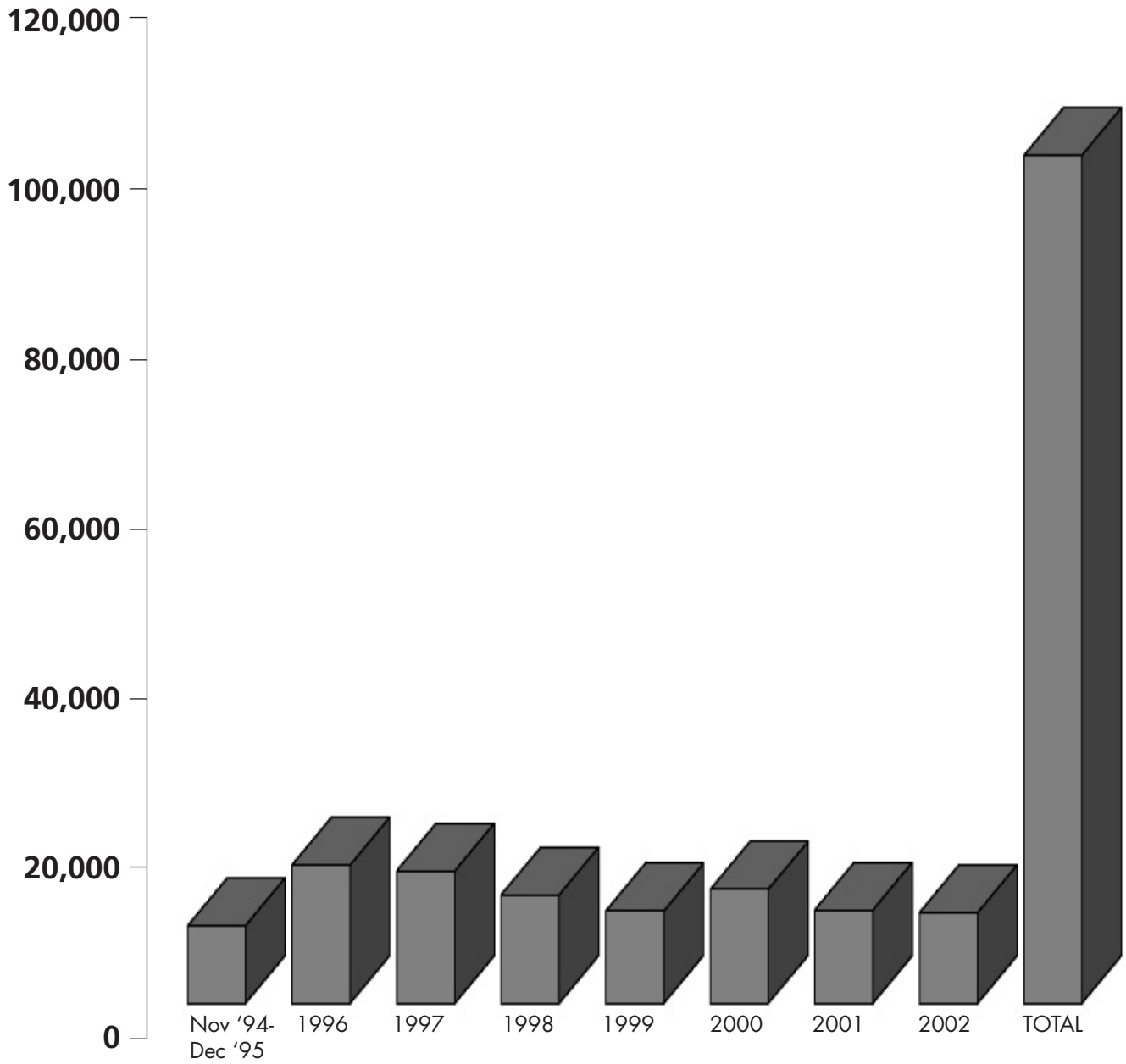
2002 Income Budget
